01. All exhibits to be grown in 2009. Except in the case of late harvested type crops.
02. One entry of any named variety in each class.
03. All exhibits to bear **correct name of variety**. 10% of points will be deducted where correct variety name is not written on entry sheet of exhibitor.
04. Judging will be in accordance with rules in Circular #50C which can be obtained from Ministry of Agriculture, Victoria, B.C. or local branches.
05. All seed in classes 1 to 11 inclusive must be grown by exhibitor and not previously shown at the IPE.
06. In sheaf classes, sheaves to be tied in two places, the top tie being immediately below heads, sheaf length in proportion to rest of sheaf, the whole being 3 1/2 inches (9 cm) in diameter at the top tie. Awards will be made with conformity to this size taken into consideration.
07. A well prepared exhibit of sheaves is a great asset to any show. This is an interesting exhibit to set up; for speed and convenience make a temporary mould, such as a 6 inch board with an end tacked on, to place the butts against and slats in two positions on each side to allow the heads to be free; before dropping the stalk into the mould you can see whether it will conform to the ones already in; when sized and tied, the butts can be trimmed with a hand saw.
08. The bundle of corn to be tied in two places
09. Grain used in making a sheaf - need not be grown by sheaf maker.
