<u>Animal Care</u> and <u>General Rules & Regulations</u> printed at the beginning of the prize list. Failure to abide by IPE rules may result in disqualification, forfeiture of prize money, and possible disbarment from the Interior Provincial Exhibition.

VETERINARY CHECKS 4-H animals will be subject to a veterinary check once on IPE premises. The inspection will be Tuesday, August 27th at 6pm. All 4-Hers are to be with their animals as the vet circulates. It is expected that all animals entering the barns should be properly vaccinated, dewormed, & deloused. No horns permitted on 4-H animals at the IPE.

NOTE: The IPE reserves the right to substitute a threeperson health check committee to observe and maintain the health of animals during the duration of the IPE

LIVESTOCK INFORMATION

- 1. All leaders need to send in signed separate livestock ID sheets listing identification numbers.
- 2. Dairy/Llamas must supply photo ID of project animal. Entries will be checked against these ID sheets.
- 3. 4-H projects entered in 4-H classes need to follow 4-H provincial regulations.
- 4. 4-H projects entered in open classes need to follow IPE specific division rules and regulations.
- 5. Dairy, Swine, Beef, and Sheep must have correct government ID tags.
- Swine Parents/Leaders are responsible for registering PigTrace movements.
- 7. NO entries will be allowed in barns unless clearly tagged or banded.
- 8. Once placed in the barns the care and preparation of animals will be carried out by 4-H member ONLY. (only in the case of safety is an adult allowed to assist).

- 9. Only 4-H members competing in the class will be allowed in the show ring.
- 10. In group classes (beef and dairy) any other person may be engaged as a showman but not more than one person per animal to be allowed in the show ring. Failure to abide may result in forfeit of class.
- 11. Showmanship classes: 4-H member must exhibit their current registered achievement project animal and be entered in their IPE project unit class. Previous year's project continued as project under new classification may not be exhibited in showmanship classes. If project has been changed before your deadline you must have documentation of approval from your district council.
- 12. No Dairy projects may be replaced within **60** days of opening day of the IPE, **30** days prior for lamb and swine.

 13. All pens/stalls must be cleaned by 8am each day and manure placed outside no later than 9am

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

- 1. Open to 4-H members currently enrolled in the 4-H BC program. Each exhibitor must be a member of a registered 4-H club in the project in which they are entering at the IPE. All 4-H & IPE rules apply for each project.
- 2. **Ages:** must be aligned with a registered 4-H club Cloverbud member: 6-8 yrs Regular 4-H member: 9-19yrs Special Project :20-21 yrs
- 3. Online entries to include exhibitor information (name, address, and number) and age of Dec 31, 2023.
- 4. All entries must be accompanied by full payment. 4-H leaders or agents, filling out entry forms on the exhibitor behalf, are responsible for errors or omissions on the entry forms.
- 5. Failure to abide by 4-H and IPE rules listed in this document will result in disqualification, forfeiture of prize money, and possible disbarment from the Interior

Provincial Exhibiton.

6. It is the winners responsibility to properly care for trophies received at the IPE. If trophy is damaged, the member may be responsible for repairing. Return trophies to the IPE office at the end of the year.

PARKING/CAMPING PASSES

- 1. 4-H members and their families will be assigned to the 4-H parking lot located off Wood Ave.
- A limit of two (2) vehicles per family. Parking \$8/day per vehicle. Camping \$10/day per trailer.
 Maximum 5 days. All camping units must be identified with the family name and associated club name, PROMINANTLY displayed.
- 3. 4-H members and family members staying in the 4-H camping areas are required to follow 4-H rules and SADD rules showing respect for others. ONLY 4-H members, families and leaders are permitted to stay in 4-H area.
- 4. Blocking fire lane will result in being towed at owners expense.

WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

Lambs must weigh in at over **90 lbs** regardless of breed. Swine must weight in at a minimum of **190 lbs**. Underweight animals can be used for showmanship class **only** Underweight animals will not be eligible for **Unit 2** projects. Underweight animals will not be sold at auction.
